

Clinging to a 14-13 lead, **Lebanon** ran out the final 7:43 of the game and defeated Cookeville Friday night at Nokes-Lasater Field. The loss was the first of the season for the Cavs (3-1) while Lebanon improved to 2-2 overall.

Soph QB Patrick Maynard rushed for one TD and threw a 54-yard touchdown pass to Jordan Stafford. Linebacker Jarvon Neal blocked Cookeville's attempted PAT midway through the fourth quarter.

All told, LHS snapped the ball 64 times (56 runs, 8 passes) while Cookeville managed only 43 snaps (19 runs and 24 pass attempts). The Blue Devils rolled up 19 first downs, Cookeville 11.

Mt. Juliet High improved to 3-0 on the season by knocking off previously undefeated Whites Creek 15-12 Friday night. Mt. Juliet's 15 points were the first allowed by the Cobra defense this year.

The Golden Bears overcame an early blocked punt that was returned for a touchdown with 348 yards in total offense -- 224 on the ground and 124 via the pass. QB Reed Gurchiek completed 6-of-13 attempts for a TD, but was picked off three times by the Cobra secondary.

Friendship Christian went on the road and spanked Clay County High 58-0 in Celina. The Commanders improved to 4-0 on the season.

FCS scored twice in the opening minutes of the game, and the rout was on. The Commanders led 35-0 after one period and eased off the gas the rest of the way.

Lee Maasen completed 3-of-6 passes for 122 yards and a touchdown. Dekolas Reeves rushed for 93 yards on just six carries and scored twice.
