

Holland one-hits Watertown

WATERTOWN -- Hunter Holland retired the first 13 batters she faced Friday and went on to throw a one-hitter as Friendship Christian defeated Watertown 12-0 at Three Forks Park.

Mary Holden's single in the bottom of the fifth was the only blemish for Holland, who struck out four with no walks.

FCS scored five in the top of the first with Brittany Petry's two-run double being the big blow and added five more in the third inning -- improving to 12-13 overall / 5-1 in District 8A.

Watertown dropped to 7-9 overall / 1-4 with the loss. The Tigerettes will be on the road Moday for a 5 p.m. game at Westmoreland. FCS visists Class AA Macon County High Moday at 5 p.m.
